

2013 - A YEAR FOR THE RECORD BOOKS AND MEALS ON WHEELS



2013 was a dynamic year that brought new challenges to the 5,000+ community Meals on Wheels programs across the country.

And yet, the resilience and dedication of our national network of local Member organizations, their staff and volunteers continued to lead the way as we successfully turned these challenges into opportunities and neutralized impending threats.

Reductions in government funding due to sequestration, a stalled economy, rapid changes to our nation's healthcare system and burgeoning numbers of Americans being added to the ranks of the senior population all increased the

demand for our national network to step up, and we did. In doing so, the Association succeeded in fighting back sequestration for 2013, leveraged partnerships to award almost **\$850,000** in grants to Member programs, held the largest national March for Meals awareness and advocacy campaign in more local communities than ever before, and offered more education and training to programs around the country.

The Meals on Wheels movement, enabling our senior neighbors to live out their lives with independence and dignity in their own homes, is one of the most effective public-private partnerships ever created. And, together, delivering over one million meals a day, we are truly making a difference. However, we have a long way to go if we are to meet the ever-growing need of our nation's most vulnerable seniors today and into the future, and we hope you will join our effort. Those who cared for us when we needed it deserve to have us there for them when they need it.



HIGHLIGHTS

The Meals On Wheels Association of America received **more than 76% of its revenues** in 2013 from donations, corporate partnerships and government grants.

Approximately seven of every ten dollars spent

by the Association in 2013 were used to support projects benefitting Members.

For every dollar in dues paid by Association members in 2013, almost six dollars in grants were awarded to Members.
